The Veranda 'House of Windsor' showhouse

The Veranda "House of Windsor" showhouse is an 8,000-square-foot spread in Los Angeles' Mandeville Canyon. Rather than have dual bathrooms in the master suite, as is increasingly popular, Smith designed a series of well-connected rooms. "As soon as you divide up the bathrooms, couples start living separate lives," Smith said. The suite includes the bedroom, a space with two sinks, a room (with door) that has the shower and toilet, and a huge dressing room with a bathtub and TV in center.
